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# **Blueprint Update**

Strong Schools Maryland has announced several priorities for the 2023 MD General Assembly Session which begins today.

- 1. Fully Fund the Blueprint for Maryland's Future
  - a. Allocations to the special fund
  - Update the pre K funding formula to include Tier 1-qualified children with developmental disabilities, those from non-English speaking households and students experiencing homelessness.
- 2. Align Blueprint Legislation with the Implementation Context
  - Fiscal mitigation measures to
     counteract low enrollment and account
     for student need in schools
  - b. Technical fixes to the law to address the availability of pre K slots
  - c. Codify best practices in the implementation of Community Schools
