Report from the first School Board Meeting:

New board member for District 6, Katie Addis was sworn in with the rest of the board. District 7 member Todd Ferrante was elected President and District 1 member Bill Buchanan was elected Vice President. Ms. Addis abstained during both elections.

The first order of business was Fall Sports athletic awards and photo ops. There were many proud parents there as well. The athletic program relates to "Minds in Motion" where athletes must maintain a minimum GPA of 3.0. Each Coach who spoke recognized and placed value on the high percentage of Athlete Scholars who meet this goal. After these awards, all the student and parents left.
