

## Voting Tips

You say you want a revolution. How do you start? It starts with voting. If the 40% of people who do not vote did -- how much power do you think they could amass?

If you aren't sure how to decide who to vote for consider the following.

- Choose an organization you believe in and see who they are endorsing.
- For a look at who is running, get the Maryland League of Women's Voter's guidebook at <https://www.vote411.org/ballot#UFoDEFHh-Sp> All responses come directly from the candidates and are unedited by LWV. The League does not support or oppose any candidates or parties.
- If you only know about some of the candidates, only vote for them. You don't have to vote for every office.

**Mail-in voting:** Sign up for a Mail-in Ballot [here](#). If you are not sure where you will be at election time, you can get your ballot by email. You can then either mail the ballot or drop it off at a drop box in your county. If you then decide to go to the polls, you will be allowed to vote by provisional ballot so they can check to see if you also voted by mail.

## Election Dates

**Primary Election** – June 23, 2026 from 7 am until 8 pm

- Early Voting for the Primary Election - Thursday, June 11, 2026 through Thursday, June 18, 2026 from 7 am until 8 pm.

**General Election** - November 3, 2026 from 7 am until 8 pm

- Early Voting for the General Election - Thursday, October 22, 2026 through Thursday, October 29, 2026 from 7 am until 8 pm.
